I was in Banda Aceh, Indonesia right after the 2004 tsunami to help Christians recover. He also sent me to Ukraine two times during this latest conflict. This recent adventure last November was one of the best trips of my life! God protected me and my team from the danger ever present including missiles and drones that were hunting civilians.

The week before I arrived, rockets took out a residential area and some businesses a mile from where I preached. A few nights later, the village next to where I was sleeping was bombarded with rockets which sounded like a thunder storm. Two days after I left, the block adjacent to where I was staying was bombed. In spite of the evil going on, we brought the Kingdom and it was a precious time encouraging believers and visiting an orphanage.

We brought food, refrigerators, stoves, pots and pans, kitchen supplies, clothes, and lots of love to the children and care givers. I preached to the children about knowing God despite being alone in life. When we know Him, we know His likes and His nature and understand how much He wants to be our friend. It was a heartfelt time as I prayed for each child. Serviss Missions was also able to send them money for Christmas presents last month because of generous partners, like you! We love you and thank God for you. I will be going back soon, so keep me in your prayers. I am also working on a trip to Pakistan because danger is my middle name.
